SCOUT OF THE YEAR AWARD



ELIGIBILITY FOR WEAR

1. May be worn by Youth Members who have been elected as Scout of the Year, and can continue to be worn after such member becomes an Adult Member.

METHOD OF WEAR

1. Worn below the right shoulder strap of the Uniform Shirt. The end of the lanyard is fastened at the left of the right breast pocket flap.
2. If awarded the Chief Commissioner's Commendation / the Chief Commissioner's High Commendation after becoming an Adult Member, the member shall choose one to wear.
3. It may not be worn on a lounge suit, Uniform Sweater, Tunic Topcoat or Mess Kit.

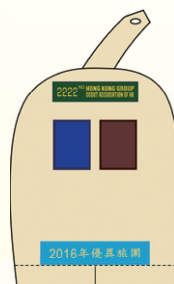

ELIGIBILITY FOR WEAR

1. May be worn by Leaders and members of a Scout Group/sectional unit which has been awarded under the Distinguished Group Award Scheme.

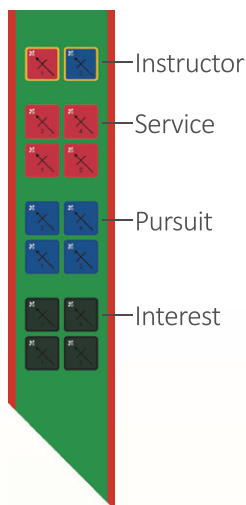
METHOD OF WEAR

1. Worn at the centre of the right sleeve of the Uniform Shirt, above the stitch. It may be worn for one year.
2. The award has 3 colours used in turn, namely red, purple and powder blue.



SCOUT PROFICIENCY BADGES SASH (SASH)

1. A piece of green cotton cloth of 13 cm wide with red borders each of 3/4 cm wide.
2. Scouts already holding the Scout Standard Award and more than 12 Proficiency Badges are eligible to put the badges onto the Sash. When more than 16 Proficiency Badges are obtained, the extra badges will be worn on the sleeve of the Uniform Shirt.
3. It is necessary to wear proper uniform when wearing the Sash.
4. Scouts are allowed to select not using the Sash and maintain the original method in wearing the badges on the sleeve.



FIXING METHOD FOR SCOUT PROFICIENCY BADGES

1. Refer to Fig. 1, the numerals represent the sequence of wearing.
2. Grouping of the badges should be followed, with Instructor Group the highest, then Service, Pursuit and Interest. Four badges will be grouped together and arranged in sequence. If a group of badges is less than four or a multiple of four, it is possible to merge into the group above. The distance between groups of badges can be according to individual height and wearing of scarf, but badges are only allowed to be worn at the front side of the Sash.

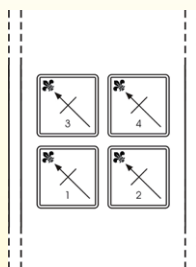
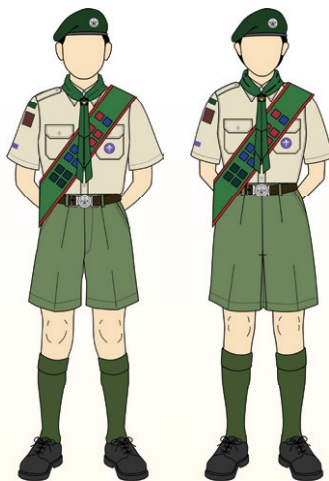

3. Except the four groups of Scout Proficiency Badges, other Awards /Badges, like the Hong Kong Award for Young People, World Conservation Badge, Community Involvement Badge, Sea and Air Activity Badges, etc. are not allowed to be worn on the Sash.

METHOD OF WEAR

1. From left shoulder to right waist.
2. The Sash is to be placed on top of the shoulder strap of the Uniform Shirt. The shoulder strap should pass through the underneath of the Sash.
3. The two ends of the Sash should join tightly at the right pocket of the shorts/culottes.
4. The Group scarf is placed on top of the Sash.



WEARING GUIDANCE

1. Scouts may wear the Sash at regular meetings or when attending ceremonial occasions like the Scout Rally. The decision of whether to wear it is up to each Troop.
2. If a Troop decides to wear the Sash, safety issues must be the primary principle. Where the situation requires, for example, at competitions/games, pioneering projects, etc., the Sash should be temporarily removed until the conclusion of such activity to avoid unnecessary injuries.

MOURNING BAND



METHOD OF WEAR



1. May be worn by Scout members on the left arm above the elbow on the Uniform Shirt, Tunic Topcoat or Uniform Sweater to denote mourning and during funerals.
2. A black crepe band of 10 cm wide is worn by Adult Members and one 5 cm wide is worn by Youth Members.
