

## 5.4. WEARING SCOUT DECORATIONS AND AWARDS

### CEREMONIAL AND FORMAL OCCASIONS

#### Overview

1. Scout members may wear Decorations and Awards on the Uniform or a lounge suit when attending ceremonial and formal occasions.
2. Ceremonial and formal occasions include ceremonial events (i.e. annual general meetings, inaugurations, weddings and funerals, etc.), parades, mess nights, balls, and functions held by other organisations, uniformed organisations or disciplined services where attendees have been asked to wear medals.

### BRONZE LION, SILVER LION, GOLD LION

### BRONZE DRAGON, SILVER DRAGON, GOLD DRAGON



1. Worn on a ribbon in the appropriate colour around the neck.
2. Only the highest award may be worn.

## AWARDS FOR GALLANTRY, AWARDS FOR MERITS, MEDALLIONS FOR SPECIAL EVENTS, MEDALLIONS FOR SPECIAL CONTRIBUTIONS, LONG SERVICE DECORATIONS

1. Worn above the centre of the right breast pocket flap of the Uniform Shirt or Tunic Topcoat, with the top edge of the medal touching the top edge of the flap.



2. If two or more medals and medallions are worn, they are positioned in the order of precedence from left to right as per Page 191 and 192 “List and Order of Precedence of Scout Decorations and Awards”.



3. If either one of the Adult Kiro Badge/ Dragon Scout Award Leader Insignia/ Baden-Powell Award Leader Insignia is being worn on the Uniform Shirt, the medal is positioned immediately below them.



4. Only the highest award may be worn.

5. If a lounge suit is being worn, it is positioned in similar position on the right breast of the jacket.



## THE CC'S COMMENDATION, THE CC'S HIGH COMMENDATION

1. Worn on a lanyard around the left shoulder below the shoulder strap of the Uniform Shirt or Tunic Topcoat.
2. The end of the lanyard is fastened to the left breast pocket flap, with the whistle inserted into the right of the pocket.
3. If awarded with both the CC's Commendation and CC's High Commendation, only the lanyard of the CC's High Commendation shall be worn.
4. It shall not be worn on a lounge suit.




## THE CC'S THANKS BADGE

1. Worn on the right lapel of the jacket of a lounge suit.
2. Worn at the centre of the right breast pocket flap of the Uniform Shirt or Tunic Topcoat.



## SERVICE EMBLEMS

1. Worn only on the Uniform Shirt.
2. The first service emblem is worn at the centre of the left sleeve of the Uniform Shirt 3 cm above the stitch. The second, third and fourth service emblems lie immediately above each other.
3. Worn in the same position on long-sleeved Uniform Shirts.
4. No emblems shall be worn after being awarded Long Service Medals.



## MESS KIT, EVENING DRESS

1. Awards for Exemplary Service are worn on ribbons around the neck.
2. Miniatures are worn on right breast lapel of the jacket above the Scout Badge in the following order of precedence from the wearer's left to right: Awards for Gallantry, Awards for Merits, Medallions, Long Service Medals.
3. Miniature Lanyard of the CC's Commendation and CC's High Commendation is worn around the left shoulder below the shoulder strap.
4. The CC's Thanks Badge is worn on the right lapel below the Scout Badge.




## INFORMAL OCCASIONS

### Overview

1. Ribbon Bars may be worn by Scout members when attending informal occasions.
2. Informal occasions are activities and training events.

## RIBBON BARS

1. Respective Ribbon Bars of all Decorations and Awards conferred may be worn above the centre of the right breast pocket flap of the Uniform Shirt or Tunic Topcoat. Only the highest award for long service may be worn.
2. They are positioned from left to right as per Page 191 and 192 “List and Order of Precedence of Scout Decorations and Awards”.



## THE CC'S COMMENDATION, THE CC'S HIGH COMMENDATION, THE CC'S THANKS BADGE

1. They are worn as per the specification on Page 188.

## SERVICE EMBLEMS

1. They are worn as per the specification on Page 189.
