

1.1. SMARTNESS AND GOOD ORDER

Scout members have long had an excellent reputation for appearance, discipline and good order that is recognized and admired by the public.

The implementation of a smart appearance and good discipline depends on Leaders' guidance. And there is no better method than to lead by example. Leaders should demonstrate high standards which will in turn influence Youth Members. All Leaders should be responsible, self-disciplined, of smart appearance and demeanor and, in this way, set an example for members and showcase the spirit of Scouting.

Set out below are a few examples of how to implement smart appearance and discipline:

- Emphasize and enforce “Smartness and Good Order” during training courses, including both Leader and Youth training courses.
- Conduct uniform inspections before and after Scout sectional unit meetings. Scout members attending are required to wear proper uniform and maintain a smart appearance.
- Ensure that training programmes focus on Scout members' demeanor, appearance, speech, conduct and attitude towards others, etc. In particular, actualize the Scout Promise and keep the Scout Law.
- Uniformed Scout members who meet on the street must, regardless of rank, remember to salute each other.
- While taking public transport, Scout members should give up their seats to the elderly, the weak, women and children, the disabled and others in need.
- While in public or participating in Scout events, Scout members should strictly observe house rules, be punctual, stay until the end and not be noisy.
